1. Report on Scholastic practices 2020-21.

- 1.1 The 5-step Experiential approach (AIM – ACTION – ANALYSIS – APPLICATION – ASSESSMENT) integrated into ANYTIME ANYWHERE LEARNING as per MoE's Pragyata guidelines.
- 1.2 Digital learning via Google Meet platform
95% students have access to attend digital mode of education. The 5% that have a lack of device or absence of parental monitoring are catered to with supply of recordings of the synchronous sessions.
- 1.3 Blended learning with synchronous transaction as well as asynchronous transaction.

4. Teachers Welfare Schemes:

All teachers are enrolled on the CBSE training portal and take up courses each month .With immense pride we wish to share that 70 of our teachers have joined the 30 30 STEM initiative by CBSE in collaboration with IIT-Gandhinagar which is equivalent to 30 hours of online training.

Courses on DIKSHA app too are completed by teachers in addition to the teacher training programmes facilitated by Alwal Cluster.

All teachers were educated about NEP 2020.

Mandatory completion of phonic training sessions for all the pre-primary & primary & L1 teachers.

Principal facilitates teacher training sessions as a RP for COE, Kakinada each month.

Principal has completed CBSE's training in Augmented reality.

Fee concession is sanctioned to the children of staff.

A Retirement fund of Rs. 25,000/- is established in the name of all teachers who have completed 10 years in service. Each year beyond their 10th year, a fund of Rs. 5,000/- is added. The sum is given to the teacher at the time of retirement at age 58 years in recognition of their contribution to school development.

6.2 We plan to add more volumes to the library, enhance the laboratory equipment and step up the skill development facilities available, renovate the front exterior of the school, upgrade the wash room facilities.

Previous year, the seminar hall was extended, fully air conditioned. All class rooms facing the ground were made sound proof.

Construction of a new block has begun which will house around 15 classrooms, office and a couple of Labs .This is expected to be completed in 2021-22.
